

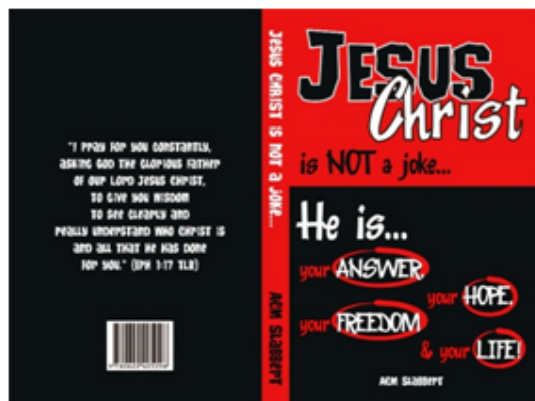

With the proceeds of selling vegetables, she started a small grocery shop in her own yard. Since then, she became interested in starting her own bakery and worked to develop the appropriate skills to do so!. Raubex supported her baking initiative by buying her first industrial mixer!

She achieved her Junior Black Belt in Judo, the first Down syndrome in South Africa ever to do so! Those privileged enough to have experienced a back and neck massage by Tineke will also want to nominate her as a Massage Champion in South Africa. Her hands work magic on any tired or worn out muscles. She is indeed a lady of many talents!



The continued support of Raubex (Pty) Ltd made it possible to have nine new vegetable tunnels setup during August 2018 at the homes of the less privileged in the township areas of Mangaung. Beneficiaries were selected by identifying yards that are neat and where vegetable crops are already grown by the owners. Tunnel structures were set up and seedling beds were prepared. Furthermore, 50 kg bags were filled with horse manure at a local horse farm and delivered to all the beneficiaries and seedlings were ordered during July 2018 from PPP Saailinge. Everyone is now eagerly waiting for the warmer spring weather to plant these vegetable seedlings before the end of September.
